## 2014 Year-End Summary

It has been another successful year for the Grants Committee. The Committee reviewed 13 grant proposals with total of \$47,100 and funded 4 grants with total of \$12,800.

Over the past decades, various contributions were made to Perl and its toolsets, some of which would not have been done without the grant program. In 2014, we have improved the grant program as follows: 1) Increased the grant review cycle frequency and started accepting proposals all the time 2) Removed the upper limit per grant 3) Publicized more grant information and added transparency.

Needless to say, the grant program is not possible without the community support. We appreciate those who donate money and time to help us. We also thank the grantees' hard work to deliver significant value back to the Perl community.

## (a) Revenues / Gains

At the beginning of the year, the Grants Committee received a budget of \$16,000.00.

The budget included funds budgeted to pay out grants that were awarded in previous years. At the beginning of 2014, the following grants were running since previous years:

- Next Release of Pinto With Key Features (\$3,000.00)
- Perl 6 Tablets (\$600.00)

The Committee cancelled all of the above by June 2014. As a result, all of the 2014 budget became allocatable for new grants to be awarded in 2014.

## (b) Expenses

The Committee approved and funded four grants in 2014, totaling to \$12,800.00.

- Perl::Lint Yet Another Static Analyzer for Perl 5 (\$800.00)
- Modern Object Oriented Programming in Perl (\$4,000.00)
- Start ACT Voyager (\$6,000.00)
- Inline::C(PP) Module Support (\$2,000.00)

All of them are still running and \$0.00 was paid out.
